



# To market we go

Tulsans will soon have three new farmers' markets to shop for asparagus, tomatoes, watermelon and everything else that farmers' market season brings.

For years, customers were glad to have just one market, the Saturday Cherry Street Farmers' Market. So the opening of three new markets — all on different days of the week — is a leap for foodies and those who support local farmers.

Shoppers can check out Cherry Street, and all of the other suburban markets, on Saturdays, and leave the new markets for the rest of the week — Downtown on Tuesdays, Brookside on Wednesdays and Pearl on Thursdays.

### Downtown Tulsa Farmers' Market

Williams Green at Third Street and Boston Avenue  
10:30 a.m. to 2 p.m. Tuesdays, beginning May 1

Before she was a full-time farmer, Donna Vogelpohl worked downtown. It was while tending her garden in Sapulpa that she thought back to those days when she wandered to Bartlett Square or the Williams Green during her lunch hour.

"It just popped in my mind one day — my god, downtown Tulsa, that's where we need a farmers' market," she said.

Vogelpohl knew how to get a market going — she's the market manager of the Jenks Farmers' Market. So she worked with Jim Norton at Downtown Tulsa Unlimited to find a suitable space.

They settled on Tuesdays at the Green Space between the Williams building and

### Cherry Street Farmers' Market at Brookside

Westlake Ace Hardware parking lot at 41st Street and Peoria Avenue  
8 a.m. to noon Wednesdays, beginning May 2

A midweek market always seemed like a good idea to Cherry Street farmers. But making it work was more difficult than they imagined.

So, the Wednesday Cherry Street Farmers' Market will move to Brookside, a location organizers hope will be more visible than last year when it was tucked behind the Tulsa Garden Center.

Leslie Moyer, market manager for the new Brookside market, in the Westlake Ace Hardware parking lot at 41st Street and Peoria Avenue, said the vendors also decided to change the hours, making it a morning market instead of late afternoon.

### Pearl Farmers' Market

Since its opening three weeks ago, Pearl has attracted a diverse crowd. Those who work during the day love that it's an evening market, and those bringing their kids along appreciate that they can shop while the kids play at Centennial Park.

Pearl is as much about homegrown fruits and vegetables as it is gourmet food. Booths of grass-fed beef, pork and lamb are next to hard-to-find herb varieties.

Sponsored by Sustainable Green Country, Pearl emphasizes locally grown and produced foods, whether it's granola or asparagus.
